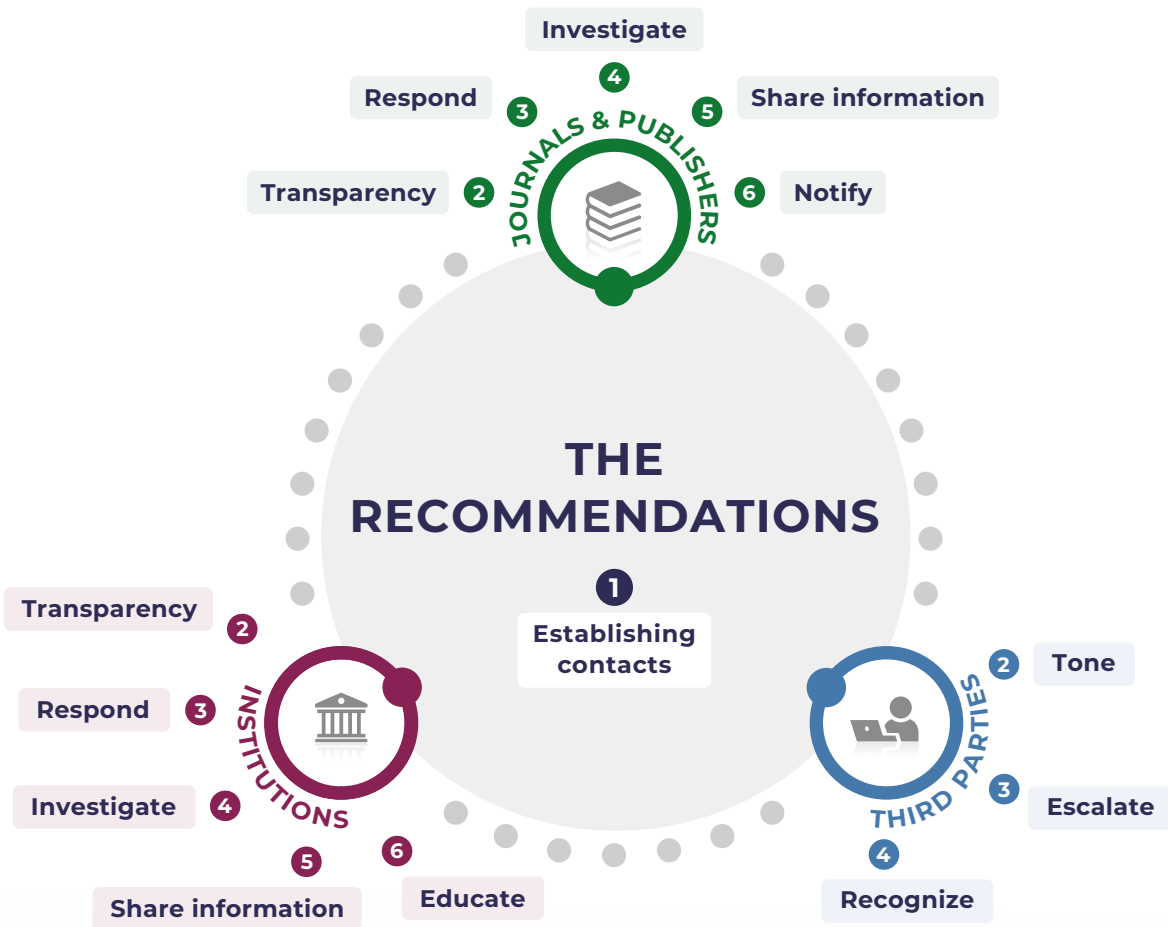




# Recommendations for making post-publication corrections



## For journals and publishers

- 1 Establishing contacts**  
Post information regarding how concerns can be raised and provide an email address.
- 2 Transparency**  
Display clear policies and processes regarding post-publication amendments.
- 3 Respond**  
Provide an initial response when concerns are raised and update on final outcome.
- 4 Investigate**  
Have a designated team to investigate concerns according to COPE guidelines and consider if author/institutional input is needed to inform outcomes.
- 5 Share information**  
Regarding paper mill cases with others as necessary (e.g. journals, publishers, societies, institutions, STM Integrity Hub).
- 6 Notify**  
Where concerns will take time to investigate consider posting a Notification on the article to alert readers to potential concerns.



## For institutions

- 1 Establishing contacts**  
Post information regarding how concerns can be raised and provide an email address.
- 2 Transparency**  
Display clear policies regarding research investigations.
- 3 Respond**  
Provide an initial response when concerns are raised and indicate whether a review will happen.
- 4 Investigate**  
Have an impartial team to investigate concerns raised.
- 5 Share information**  
With publishers as necessary to amend the published literature.
- 6 Educate**  
Implement strategies to support research integrity (e.g. verifying authorship and data).



## For third parties

- 1 Establishing contacts**  
Where possible contact the journal/publisher directly and simultaneously if multiple journals/publishers involved; consider noting the concern on PubPeer.
- 2 Tone**  
Maintain professional tone and language in all communications and avoid potentially defamatory language.
- 3 Escalate**  
If you do not receive a response from the journal/publisher escalate via COPE or the authors' institution.
- 4 Recognize**  
Investigations and due diligence takes time; substantive updates may not be available until the case is resolved.
